"Neuroscience -- An Important Field for Biomedical Engineering"

DESCRIPTION:

Why should Biomedical Engineers be interested in the brain, spinal cord, and diseases of the nervous system? Neuroscience research at the University of Connecticut and Health Center covers many aspects of neuroscience and generates many interesting problems that need solutions. Biomedical engineering training may be extremely useful in solving these problems. Research by Dr. Oliver and other UCONN faculty on the auditory system, hearing and deafness will be highlighted as examples. We will also introduce the UCONN Neuroscience in Salamanca Spain summer study abroad program that is available to biomedical engineering students. This program allows engineering students to take neuroscience courses in the summer without interfering with the normal Biomedical Engineering requirements.
